

**CAMPBELL COUNTY FISCAL COURT  
MINUTES**

**June 16, 2010**

A regular meeting of the Campbell County Fiscal Court was held on Wednesday, June 16, 2010, at 5:30 p.m. at the Fiscal Court Chambers, 1098 Monmouth Street, Newport, Kentucky.

Preceding the opening of the Fiscal Court meeting, a public hearing was held at 5:15 p.m. to hear the report of the County Road Supervisor and “viewers” regarding the discontinuance of County Road #1246, Bob Huber Drive. Present at the hearing were:

Melissa Williams provided background on the request to discontinue County Road #1246 also known as Bob Huber Drive. Chief Keith Hill, one of the viewers appointed to go with the County Road Engineer to view the road and determine what inconvenience, if any, would result from the discontinuance presented the report. He advised that on June 10, 2010, he, Peter Klear and Ken Schultz viewed County Road #1246, Bob Huber Drive, as stated in the legal notice. In his opinion County Road #1246 no longer exists, and serves no purpose; he agrees that the road should be discontinued, including the parcels owned by the Campbell County Economic Progress Authority. Mr. Klear, the other viewer, agreed that the road no longer exists and there will be no inconvenience to the public as a result of the closure of this drive. There being no further comments or questions, the public hearing was closed at 5:23 p.m.

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Commissioner Otto.

Commissioner Otto asked for a moment of silence followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner Otto requested a motion appointing him to preside over the meeting in the absence of Judge/Executive Steve Pendery. Motion was made by Commissioner Rehtin, seconded by Commissioner Hayden. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

Commissioner Otto announced that anybody who has business with the Fiscal Court should raise their hand, come to the podium, introduce themselves and state their business.

Following roll call, a quorum was declared present. Cable Access was present to film the meeting.

Minutes from the Fiscal Court meeting held on June 2, 2010 were presented by Commissioner Otto. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Rehtin to approve the minutes. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

Commissioner Otto invited comments from the audience.

Rita Hauke, a resident of Northern Kentucky, told of her experiences about five years ago when she was diagnosed with asthma after having trouble breathing when she patronized places that allowed smoking. She told of going to a bar that was open to the outside and still suffered an asthma attack due to the smoke; her inhaler does not help with smoke-induced attacks. Ms. Hauke believes that it is very important to everybody to have a smoke-free county. She knows that many people are opposed to further government regulation, but the government is already involved in many aspects of our lives and businesses. She stated that the Fiscal Court should be proud of the Guys and Dolls establishment which is smoke-free and is always crowded. Ms. Hauke hopes that the County will adopt a comprehensive smoking plan in place by July 15.

Commissioner Hayden asked for the current status of the discussions on the smoke-free ordinance. Robert Horine responded that discussion is continuing among representatives of all three counties with the hope that any regulation would be coordinated across that entire Northern Kentucky region. Recently Judges Pendery and Drees spoke with the Northern Kentucky Independent Health Department regarding the Health Department's role in providing enforcement of such an ordinance if it were passed.

Zana Lummus, a resident of Cold Spring, has emphysema as a result of smoking for 40 years. She stated that she can not go to places where there is smoking. Ms. Lummus stated that she is sympathetic to people who are against smoke-free public places; she had a very hard time quitting smoking about 14 years ago. She pointed out that the Greater Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky region has the highest rate of Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD). Ms. Lummus encouraged the Fiscal Court to support any efforts for smoking cessation programs and support smoke-free air in public places in Northern Kentucky.

Chris Robinson asked if there were figures on the projected return on the investment for the retrofit lighting project. Robert Horine replied that they are projecting a savings of \$37,000 per year based on current utility rates as a result of the contract for lighting retrofits at 13 County facilities. The County will also receive a little over \$10,000 in rebates from Duke Energy as

soon as the improvements are made. He estimated that the County will recover the entire amount of the Federal funds being used to fund the retrofits in about seven years.

Chris Robinson stated that about 12,500 residents of Campbell County are subscribers to Insight Cable which is the primary means for a lot of people to view the operation of the County if they do not attend Fiscal Court meetings. He listed the days and times that Fiscal Court meetings are rebroadcast on cable TV. Mr. Robinson asked that the Fiscal Court consider alternative methods of media delivery of meetings such as: webcasting, podcasting, and imbedded video on the Campbell County website. He cited statistics of the percentage of Americans owning cell phones with broadband access to view podcasts. Commissioner Otto stated that it sounds like a good idea and they will look into it. Robert Horine announced that the County's new website will be launched this Friday at 10:00 a.m.

JR Roth, citizen, stated that he looked at the budget and saw a Department of Energy consultant fee for \$35,000, and asked if it is part of the stimulus program. Robert Horine stated that those funds are administration fees allowed to be used by the County. Half of the funds will be used to pay the Northern Kentucky Area Development District for handling reporting to the Federal Government on use of the stimulus money, the other half will go into the County's general fund to pay for staff time involved in the administration of the project. One of the conditions of the Federal stimulus money is that you can't use money for improvements to golf courses. The County plans to use the \$18,000 coming to it for administrative expenses to offset the \$18,000 cost for improvements to the golf course and pro shop at the golf course. Mr. Horine stated that \$18,000 is included in the \$275,000 of Federal funds and the other \$18,000 is in addition to it.

Mr. Roth then noted that the Election Officers' budget is increased by 100% and asked why. Jim Seibert stated that that is due to the number of elections this year – a general election and a primary.

Mr. Roth stated that the water rescue equipment that Campbell County "gave" to Boone County Water Rescue doesn't have Campbell County's name on it. Robert Horine explained that Campbell County Water Rescue and Boone County Water Rescue were merged into a single agency serving all of Northern Kentucky including Kenton County. The name of the merged agency is "Boone County Water Rescue". Part of the reason is that Boone County Water Rescue has been one of the preeminent water rescue agencies throughout the country. It was agreed in the merger to use the name of Boone County Water Rescue. He stated that the Fiscal Court did not own the equipment directly; it was owned by Campbell County Water Rescue with support from the Campbell County Fiscal Court. The agreement provides that if the merged agency would dissolve or Campbell County withdrew, the equipment would be returned to Campbell County or a credit for the cost of the equipment as depreciated. Mr. Horine stated that the County's interests were protected in the agreement.

Mr. Roth asked if the County was getting a new animal shelter because there is \$250,000 in the budget for a new animal shelter. Jim Seibert explained that the allocation is for an addition to the animal shelter, and is contingent upon receiving a grant. Mr. Roth asked if the County is tearing this building down; there is \$346,000 for administration building demolition. Mr. Seibert

stated that that allocation is to cover any expenses that come up regarding property; he didn't have a copy of the budget with him, but will check into it.

Mr. Roth then asked about the increase in revenue for federal prisoners. Jim Seibert stated that the number of federal inmates has increased and they are expecting an increase in the per diem rate which the County receives for federal prisoners next year.

Mr. Roth stated that the budget shows that the Commissioner's staff is down 50%.

Mr. Roth stated that he sent an email to Commissioner Rehtin regarding the \$47,000 lawnmower. He has found some refurbished units that are cheaper.

Mr. Roth stated that he quit smoking about five years ago, but he believes in a free market. He stated that the City of Cincinnati passed a smoking ordinance and now another establishment in Cincinnati has closed because the customers were not allowed to smoke. He referred to the woman who spoke earlier about going to an open-air establishment; if there were nonsmoking regulations the way that she wants, people wouldn't be able to smoke in their own yards. He stated that apparently the free market system works because she was able to go to an establishment that was smoke-free. Mr. Roth stated that we don't need laws that will put businesses out of business.

Commissioner Otto stated that the mower that Mr. Roth suggested from Global Turf Equipment was \$23,500 plus shipping. Commissioner Rehtin stated that there were several units that were cheaper than that. He suggested that Mr. Horine will be able to explain this when they get to the fairway mower item on the agenda.

Melissa Williams presented new business with Ordinance O-07-10 which was read by title and summary given. O-07-10 discontinues Bob Huber Drive, County Road #1246 located off of US 27 in unincorporated Campbell County, Kentucky, which has now been replaced with the reconstruction of US 27 pursuant to KRS 178.070, including right-of-way owned by the Campbell County Economic Progress Authority (CCEPA) and identified in PIDN 999-99-35-473.00, and authorizing the necessary legal action as to such. This ordinance was the subject of the public hearing held prior to the regular meeting. The CCEPA requested the discontinuance of Old Bob Huber Drive. This is a first reading of the ordinance and no action is necessary at this time.

Resolution R-78-10 was read by title and summary given. R-78-10 authorizes the County Judge/Executive to execute an addendum to the Contract between the Fiscal Court and the City of Silver Grove, Kentucky, regarding mowing work on Uhl Road within the City limits. Ms. Williams explained that the City of Silver Grove has requested the County's assistance again this year; when the County's crew is in the area, they will cut and trim along Uhl Road. Commissioner Rehtin made a motion to adopt R-78-10, seconded by Commissioner Otto. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

Resolution R-80-10 was read by title and summary given. R-80-10 authorizes the County Judge/Executive to execute a Contract with Alleman LLC d/b/a System 4, to provide general

cleaning services for the Campbell County Senior Center for Fiscal Year 2011. This is a renewal of an existing Contract in the same amount as last year - \$6,000 annually. Marsha Dufeck, Senior Center Director, recommends continuance of the Contract. Commissioner Rehtin made a motion to adopt R-80-10, seconded by Commissioner Hayden. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

A motion was requested to adjust the salaries of police officers, Patrolman through Lieutenant inclusive, of the Campbell County Police Department by 3.5% which represents a 2.5% step increase and 1% cost of living adjustment in accordance with the Working Agreement with Lodge #10 of the Fraternal Order of Police effective July 1, 2010. Motion was made by Commissioner Rehtin, seconded by Commissioner Hayden. Robert Horine explained that the County negotiates with two bargaining units – the Fraternal Order of Police and AFSCME. The working agreements are currently in the last year of a four-year agreement. They did not anticipate the economic downturn at the time the contracts were negotiated. Mr. Horine stated that both bargaining units appoint members to negotiate with Fiscal Court staff. Once an agreement is reached it is presented to the Fiscal Court for approval and to the members of the unions for their review and approval. The agreements outline the terms and conditions of their working arrangements with the County, including compensation. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

A motion was requested to adjust the salaries of all non-supervisory employees of the Road and Recreation Departments, excluding seasonal employees, by 2.5% in accordance with the Working Agreement with Local #286, AFSCME effective July 1, 2010. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Rehtin. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

A motion was requested to accept the letter of intent to retire from Ann Zeis, Animal Technician at the Campbell County Animal Shelter, effective July 6, 2010. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Rehtin. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed. Commissioner Otto stated that Ms. Zeis has been with the County for 20 years.

A motion was requested to authorize staff to advertise, interview and hire for the position of Animal Technician at the Campbell County Animal Shelter. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Rehtin. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

A motion was requested to accept the letter of resignation from John Austin, Campbell County Economic Progress Authority President (CCEPA), effective June 18, 2010. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Hayden. Commissioner Rehtin asked if Mr. Austin was an employee of the Fiscal Court or the Economic Progress Authority. Robert Horine explained that Mr. Austin was originally employed by the Fiscal Court as a Government Relations Manager. Last August he was chosen as the new President of the CCEPA, and the Fiscal Court "loaned" him to the CCEPA. The Fiscal Court pays Mr. Austin and is reimbursed for his salary and benefits by the CCEPA. He stated that the CCEPA intends to conduct a search for a new president. He reiterated that the position is fully funded by the CCEPA, not the Fiscal Court. The new President does not necessarily have to have any relationship with the Fiscal

Court. Commissioner Rehtin stated that allowing CCEPA use of office space in the Administration building is a good idea. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

Ms. Williams then presented motions for appointments to various boards. A motion was requested to reappoint Don Girton to the Campbell County Extension District Board for a three year term effective June 28, 2010 through June 27, 2013. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Rehtin. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

A motion was requested to appoint Christine Geiman to the Campbell County Extension Board for a three-year term effective June 28, 2010 through June 27, 2013. Ms. Geiman will fill the position vacated by Fred Hockney who requested not to be reappointed. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Rehtin. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

A motion was requested to reappoint Chuck Pettit to the Central Fire District Board of Trustees for a three-year term effective July 2, 2010 through June 30, 2013. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Rehtin. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

A motion was requested to reappoint Kay Wright to the Fire District One Board of Trustees for a three-year term effective July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2013. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Rehtin. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

A motion was requested to reappoint Ed Schroeder to Fire District #6 Board of Trustees (Melbourne) for a three-year term effective July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2013. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Rehtin. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

A motion was requested to reappoint Bernie Henke to the Southern Fire District Board of Trustees for a three-year term effective July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2013. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Rehtin. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

A motion was requested to appoint Doug Carmack to the Alexandria Fire District Board of Trustees for a three-year term effective July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2013. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Hayden. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

A motion was requested to accept the resignation of Richard M. Nielson from the Central Campbell Fire District Board of Trustees effective June 16, 2010. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Rehtin. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

A motion was requested to appoint Clarence Martin to fill the unexpired term of Richard M. Nielson on the Central Campbell Fire District Board of Trustees effective June 17, 2010 through

June 30, 2011. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Rehtin. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

A motion was requested to reappoint John Ellison to the Northern Kentucky Convention and Visitors Commission for a three-year term effective August 1, 2010 through July 31, 2013. Mr. Ellison was nominated by the Northern Kentucky Chapter of the Kentucky Restaurant Association. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Hayden. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

A motion was requested to reappoint Tammy Bravo to the Northern Kentucky Convention and Visitors Commission for a three-year term effective August 1, 2010 through July 31, 2013. Ms. Bravo was nominated by the Northern Kentucky Hotel and Lodging Association. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Rehtin. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

Robert Horine requested that the Fiscal Court meet in executive session at the end of the meeting pursuant to KRS 61.810(1)(b) to discuss the acquisition or sale of real property. No action will be taken as a result of the executive session. He suggested that a motion be made at the end of the regular business.

Commissioner Rehtin stated that he has talked to Robert Horine about people who have gravel drives which get washed out due to heavy rainfalls. He asked Robert Horine to explain how the Road Department has been addressing this issue due to the recent heavy rains. Mr. Horine stated that over the last 7 days there has been 10 inches of rain in the southern part of Campbell County resulting in a lot of wash-outs. He stated that the primary responsibility of the Road Department is to keep the roads open and safe for traffic. The Road Department tries to push the gravel back into the driveways. He stated that at this time of year the Road Department regularly cleans the culverts along the side of roads to keep them clear and the roads clear and safe.

Commissioner Otto announced that the Ft. Thomas Garden Club will host a garden tour on Saturday, June 19, 2010 from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Commissioner Otto stated that he has received questions about the emergency sirens. The sirens were activated this week and some people still do not know what to do when the sirens sound. Mr. Horine encouraged people to check the County's website at the Office of Emergency Management tab where they can read about outdoor alerting devices. The sirens are intended to alert people outdoors of dangerous weather conditions or other circumstances present in the area. Residents should first take cover, and then check the radio or TV to get details. He stated that the outdoor sirens are not intended to be heard indoors. They recommend that people have a weather radio at their homes. He explained that the sirens are activated if there is a severe thunderstorm warning and a tornado watch, or if there is a tornado warning. The sirens were activated earlier in the week due to a tornado warning issued for the northern part of Campbell County. Commissioner Hayden stated that two nights ago when the alarms went off and the storm was rolling in, he lost electric at his home. Fortunately he had a battery-powered weather radio that they could listen to. He recommended that people have a battery-powered radio.

Commissioner Otto announced that there will be a special meeting of the Fiscal Court held on June 30, 2010 at 5:30 p.m. at the Alexandria Courthouse to wrap-up business before the end of the fiscal year, including a second reading of the new budget.

Jim Seibert presented R-81-10 by title and summary given. R-81-10 authorizes the County Judge/Executive to execute a Lease Agreement with the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC), an agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Court of Justice, for continued use of the District Court Building in Newport. The prior Lease with AOC covered a bond issue for the building. The bonds have been paid off and a new lease is needed to effect the rental payments and reimbursement of expenses. Commissioner Otto made a motion to adopt R-81-10, seconded by Commissioner Rehtin. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

A motion was requested to authorize the purchase of a Toro Fairway Mower using the State Contract price of \$47,282.60 for use at the A J Jolly Golf Course. Motion was made by Commissioner Rehtin, seconded by Commissioner Otto. Robert Horine advised that they looked into Mr. Roth's suggestion to purchase a refurbished mower. When they determined that the existing fairway mower needed to be replaced, they talked about different options, including used equipment. They focused on looking for used equipment in this area, so that they could operate the equipment and examine it. None of the equipment that was available was deemed to be of value. After several months of looking, staff recommended that a new mower be purchased. Mr. Horine stated that they did look at a company in Florida that sells refurbished equipment. Global Turf Equipment buys mowers at the end of lease terms. Since the company is in Florida, it would be costly to send someone to inspect the equipment. Global had several 2006 models of the same model that staff recommends at a cost of \$23,500 plus shipping. The units available had at least 1,200 hours of operation (one hour of operation is equal to about 50 miles of driving); the County's mower that they wish to replace has 3,800 hours of operation. Mr. Horine explained that once a piece of equipment is selected from Global, the buyer must put down a 50% deposit and they will proceed to refurbish the equipment; it is unknown how long that process would take. The refurbishing does not include work that the County deems important. He compared Global's standard warranty for 30 days, parts only, with a new unit's two year parts and labor warranty. He also pointed out advantages of buying from a local dealer. Mr. Horine stated that they checked into local dealers that are under the State contract – one was close in price to the unit that staff recommends and the other was \$53,000. Commissioner Rehtin stated that it is important that they continue to look for the most cost-effective solutions to capital purchases. Commissioner Otto stated that Steve Myers, Golf Course Superintendent, did his homework on recommending the purchase of a new mower. He had a copy of the entire maintenance file on the current mower. Commissioner Hayden stated that he talked to Mr. Myers and reviewed the maintenance records and agreed that the mower needs to be replaced. He is impressed with the amount of time that staff took to compare the purchase of a new vs. used mower. He was also impressed with the time and effort that Mr. Myers spent to extend the life of the current mower. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

Resolution R-75-10 was read by title and summary given. R-75-10 approves funding for the Transit Authority of Northern Kentucky (TANK) for Fiscal Year 2011. The amount funded is \$4,182,191. Commissioner Otto made a motion to adopt R-75-10, seconded by Commissioner Rehtin. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed. Jim Seibert advised that this is the same

amount allocated to TANK last year due to TANK dipping into its reserves to meet its budget. The formula used to determine the contribution from each County was agreed upon by the members of the three Fiscal Courts based upon miles and hours of service and population living within a mile and one-half of bus routes.

Resolution R-76-10 was read by title and summary given. R-76-10 renews the contract with the Kentucky Association of Counties All Lines Fund for property and liability insurance coverage effective July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011. Mr. Seibert stated that the annual premium is \$337,378 which is a little less than last year's premium. Commissioner Rehtin made a motion to adopt R-76-10, seconded by Commissioner Otto. Mr. Seibert stated that they did get three bids, and this was the best one. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

Resolution R-77-10 was read by title and summary given. R-77-10 renews a contract with the Kentucky Association of Counties for Workers' Compensation Insurance coverage effective July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011. Mr. Seibert stated that the annual premium is \$249,506. Commissioner Rehtin made a motion to adopt R-77-10, seconded by Commissioner Otto. Commissioner Rehtin stated that he would like to see more of an effort made next year to get other bids that he believes would be competitive to KACo's bid. He knows of another company that could bid on this that is providing coverage for other cities and counties in Kentucky. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

Mr. Seibert then requested a motion to approve the claims and supplemental claims as presented for June 16, 2010. County Attorney Jim Daley stated that he has reviewed the claims and all appear appropriate. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto. Commissioner Hayden asked about a charge on page 13 of the claims for legal fees in the Nolan lawsuit. He thought that the insurance company was now covering these fees. Mr. Daley stated that he sent a letter to KACo to determine why we are still paying these fees; he is waiting for a response. Commissioner Hayden also asked about a charge from Reyser Bicycle Outfitters for a bike dock in the amount of \$386. Melissa Williams stated that this is for two U-shaped bicycle racks to be installed at the County Administration Building. The County's maintenance crew will install the racks. She did get other quotes and this was the best price. Commissioner Hayden hopes that this encourages employees to bike to work and other people doing business at the County Building. Motion was made by Commissioner Otto, seconded by Commissioner Hayden. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

Commissioner Otto stated that there would be a presentation tomorrow for employees about biking to work. Commissioner Hayden explained that Cincinnati Leadership is working on a bike to work program. They are visiting companies and organizations to talk to employees about biking to work, and will be talking to County and City of Newport employees at the County Building tomorrow. Companies and organizations can get ranked on the facilities that they provide to their employees. Robert Horine stated that everybody is invited to the presentation at the County Building tomorrow at noon.

A motion was made by Commissioner Rehtin, seconded by Commissioner Hayden to meet in executive session to discuss the acquisition or sale of real property pursuant to KRS

61.810(1)(b). There will be no action taken as a result of the executive session. The executive session was convened at 6:45 p.m.

Motion was made by Commissioner Rehtin, seconded by Commissioner Otto to adjourn the executive session. All voted "AYE" and the motion passed.

There being no further business to come before the Fiscal Court, Commissioner Rehtin made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Commissioner Otto. All voted "AYE" and the meeting adjourned at 7:36 p.m.
